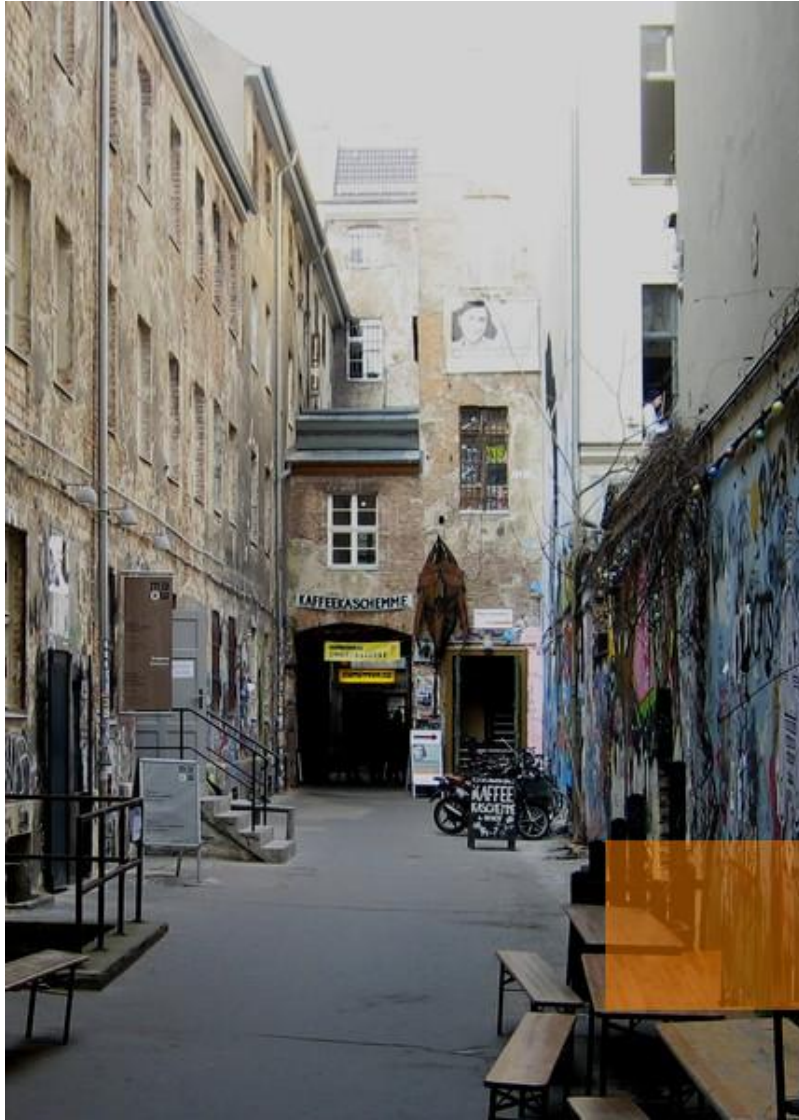

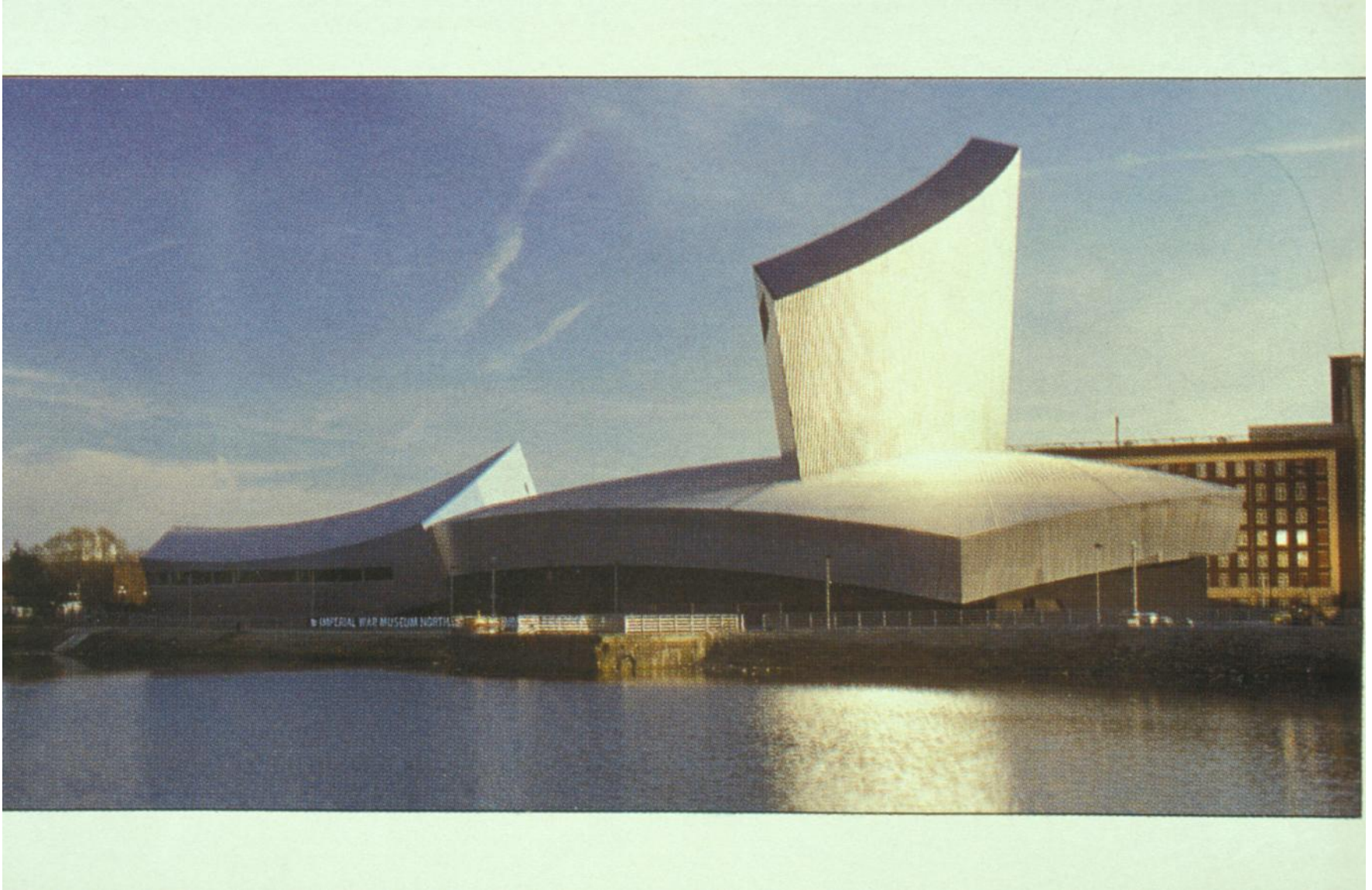

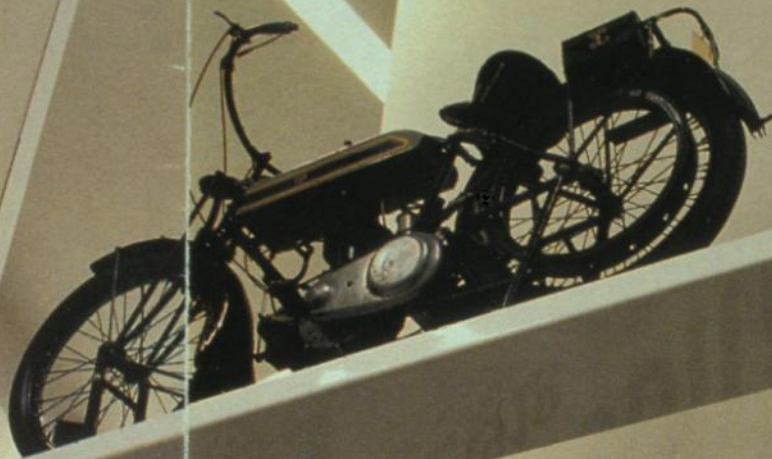

In 1914 war sweeps across Europe



THE WESTERN FRONT 1914-1918
The Western Front consisted of all battles fought from the west to Switzerland, from a beginning a complicated of defenses gradually developed.
Trenches were dug to protect the front and the line was held under the constant bombardment of shells and machine gun fire. In 1914, average height of men was an average of 5'6" tall. In the first year of the war, 1.5 million men were killed. Most were young men, but as the war progressed, the death toll increased.
